**Dr David Clarke**

David graduated from Trinity College Dublin in 1978 and became a House Officer in Dublin Dental School and Hospital. After a short while in private practice, David joined the Public Dental Service, becoming Principal Dental surgeon in 1989. He completed a Masters in Dental Public Health in UCC in 2000. David is now Assistant National Oral Health Lead with a lead role in ICT and epidemiology, and is Principal Dental Surgeon in Dublin Mid-Leinster. He is former Secretary to the HSE Dental Surgeons Committee of the IDA.

**Prof. Chris Deery**

Chris graduated from Edinburgh University. Following periods in general dental practice and the Community Dental Service, he undertook an MSc in Child Dental Health at the University of Bristol. Following this he moved to the University of Dundee where he gained a PhD. He became a Consultant in Paediatric Dentistry in Edinburgh in 2001 and took up a Chair in Paediatric Dentistry at the University of Sheffield in 2006. His research interests are preventive dentistry, cariology, evidence-based dentistry and child-focused research.

**Dr Lorna Dobbyn**

Lorna is Consultant Orthodontist for HSE West, based at Merlin Park University Hospital Galway. Her undergraduate training was completed at Trinity College Dublin, and higher training was completed in the UK. She undertook orthodontic specialist training at the University of Dundee Dental School and Senior registrar/FTTA training at the University of Glasgow Dental School. Her area of specialist interest is outcome in cleft lip and palate patients, and she has published a number of papers in this area.

**Dr Joseph Greenberg**

Joseph received his degree and postdoctoral training from the University of Pennsylvania, where he is Clinical Professor of Periodontics. He invented the facial plane relator, and the etched porcelain-fused-to-metal resin-bonded bridge. He is former executive director and President of the Charles L. Pincus Foundation, founder and first President of "Kids Smiles", a non-profit community centre for children's dental health, and founding Vice President of The National Children's Oral Health Foundation.

Sue qualified in Cardiff and has worked in hospital and community dental services throughout her career. She is a Consultant in Special Care Dentistry (SCD) in South Wales where she is also Clinical Director of the Community Dental Service, which provides services for vulnerable groups. She is Past President and Chair of the British Society for Disability and Oral Health and received an Honorary Fellowship from Cardiff University. She teaches SCD in the UK and internationally. Sue was honoured to become President of the British Dental Association in 2006.



Dr Ken Heritage

Ken graduated from UCD in 1978. He opened a private practice in Castlerea, Co. Roscommon, in 1980, and currently maintains a dental and implant clinic and a referral practice for endodontics at that address.
